

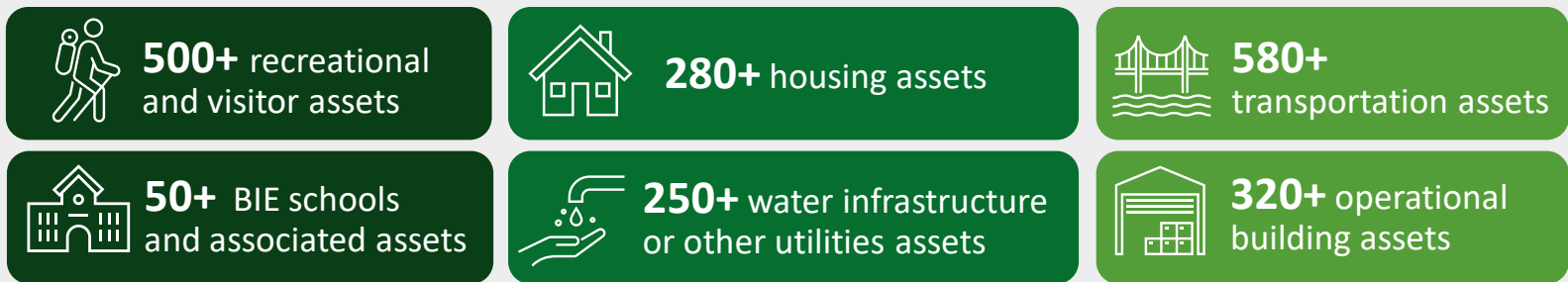


GREAT AMERICAN OUTDOORS ACT

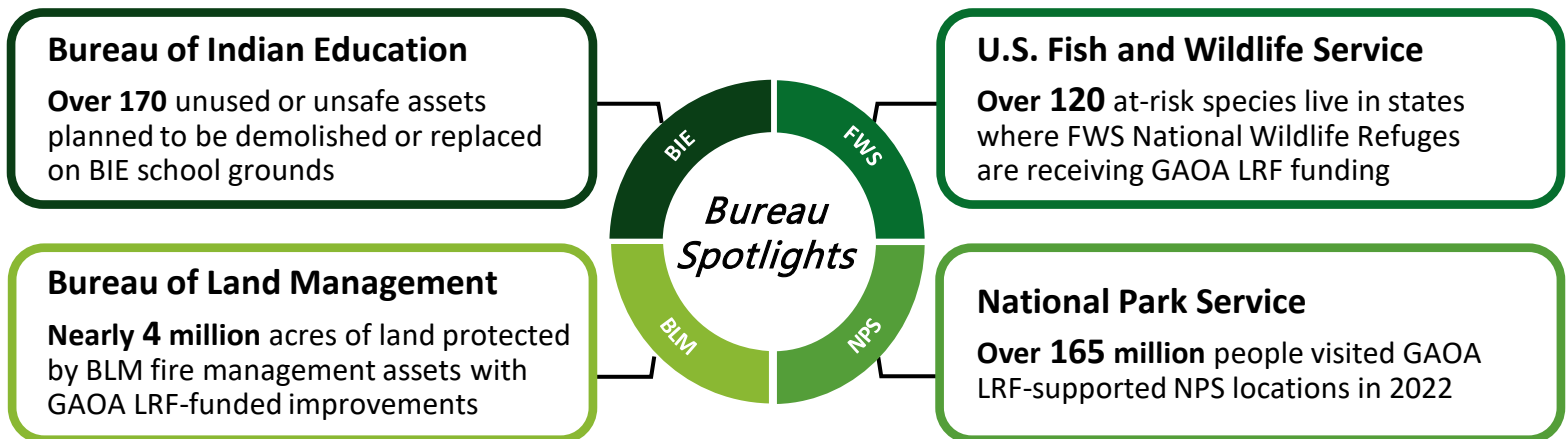
Program Impact: First Three Years

The Great American Outdoors Act National Parks and Public Land Legacy Restoration Fund (GAOA LRF), enacted on August 4, 2020, is a historic investment in much-needed maintenance for critical facilities and infrastructure on America’s public lands and Bureau of Indian Education funded schools. From the breathtaking vistas of the Grand Canyon to the diverse wildlife of the Everglades, GAOA LRF funds are improving thousands of Department of the Interior assets across the United States.

Through Fiscal Year 2023, GAOA LRF is funding **276 projects** across **50 states** and multiple U.S. territories to address an estimated **\$3.4B** in deferred maintenance and repairs. These projects collectively plan to improve **2,100+ Interior assets**:



The following measures illustrate the expected impact of GAOA LRF Projects across Interior bureaus.



In total, Interior bureaus have programmed **\$4.8B** in funding and obligated **over \$2.3B**.



As of September 2023, **110** projects are in the planning phases, **102** are in construction, and **59** are either substantially or fully complete***. GAOA LRF has also funded Maintenance Action Teams completing repairs at **126** locations.

*Funding for projects with at least one asset in a county with a score in the top 20% of the Centers for Disease Control's (CDC) Social Vulnerability Index (SVI). Only assets documented in the Federal Real Property Profile are considered in calculating this measure.

**Dollars rounded to the nearest \$100 million.

***Project totals as of September 2023 – Maintenance Action Team projects are not included in counts.
