

Federal Wildlife Proposal

Proponent: Seward Peninsula Subsistence Regional Advisory Council

Issue

Extend the fall moose season and establish a winter moose hunt in the Unit 22A Unalakleet hunt area to match current State seasons. Specifically, extend the fall season to Aug. 1 – Sept. 30 and establish a winter hunt from Dec. 1 – last day of Feb.

Current Federal regulation:

Unit 22A- Moose

Unit 22A, that portion in the Unalakleet drainage and all drainages flowing into Norton Sound north of the Golsovia River drainage and south of and including the Egavik Creek drainage—1 bull by Federal registration permit. Aug. 15- Sep. 14

Federal public lands are closed to the taking of moose except by federally qualified users hunting under these regulations. The BLM Anchorage Field Office is delegated authority to close the season in consultation with ADF&G

Proposed Federal regulation:

Unit 22A- Moose

Unit 22A, that portion in the Unalakleet drainage and all drainages flowing into Norton Sound north of the Golsovia River drainage and south of and including the Egavik Creek drainage—1 bull by Federal registration permit. Aug. 1-15- Sep. 30-14 Dec. 1-Last day of Feb.

Federal public lands are closed to the taking of moose except by federally qualified users hunting under these regulations. The BLM Anchorage Field Office is delegated authority to close the season in consultation with ADF&G

Justification

Extending the fall season and establishing the winter season will bring Federal regulations in alignment with State regulations, which were recently changed. This will reduce regulatory complexity and potential for confusion. Currently, Federal regulations are more restrictive than State regulations. This proposal will give federally qualified subsistence users additional opportunity to meet subsistence needs.
