BIE receives 5%, or \$95 million, of GAOA LRF funding each year for a total of \$475 million across all five years. At BIE-funded schools, GAOA LRF is funding projects that are demolishing unused and outdated facilities; replacing school campuses with modern, safe facilities; and improving housing for staff. These projects will improve learning environments for students, teachers, and staff at BIE-funded schools.

Largest Funded BIE Project

BIE's largest funded project is at Many Farms High School in Arizona, where the bureau is investing over \$230 million in investments to replace the high school campus and facilities to reduce long-term operating costs, improve safety for students and staff, and enhance accessibility. With GAOA LRF funding in place, this project will improve student learning and access to safe learning facilities.

2,200+ Students & Faculty Impacted

GAOA LRF projects create positive educational experiences for over 2,200 BIE students and faculty annually by providing safe and modern facilities that are conducive to student learning.

190+ Assets Demolished or Replaced

GAOA LRF funding is supporting the demolition or replacement of 190 assets on BIE-funded school campuses to modernize facilities for thousands of students and staff in Tribal communities.

26 BIE-Schools Receiving GAOA LRF Funding GAOA LRF is improving the conditions of or demolishing deteriorated facilities at 26 BIE-funded boarding and day schools. Along with repairs to educational facilities, project work is also replacing and renovating school staff housing to improve staff recruitment and retention, reducing costs related to ongoing maintenance, and improving safety of residential buildings.
