### What Do Park Ranger Interpreters Do?

Interpretation can be a confusing term because it has multiple meanings. No, we don't all speak another language! In this context, interpretation refers to the work of rangers and other staff who interpret the park to visitors. Interpreters aim to help visitors make their own connections to the park and its stories. They want the people who visit to see themselves in park stories and make intellectual and emotional connections to park resources.



To help people make these connections, interpreters try to learn a lot about the park where they work. They should have a good understanding of the things people ask about: the history of the park, the plants and animals that call it home, and lots of other related topics. Interpreters need to do their homework!
