Thank you for your continuing efforts to expedite the complaint I originally fileo with USDOJ in February 2015.
At allachment is a letter received from USDOT referencing HCR-20 and DOT\#2016-0050 indicating the complain! has been referred back to DOJ.

I have been unable to contacl anyone at the USDOJ Clvil Rights Division at the number provided 202-307-0663.
After reading the altached correspondence, and speaking with City of Leon Valley Public Works Director Ms. Melinda Moriz, It has become evident that no one in each of the Federal Agencies through which my complaint has been routed has contacted me directly for details, nor have they offered to meet with me and other interested cilizens to listen to specific details and to actually visit, and visit, the trail site. Instead they have apparently contacted the City of Leon Valley directly and have been provided misinformation.

The referenced LC-17 Project is a flood control project extending along Huebner Creek from the southern City boundary to the Bandera Rd, bridge and does not extend into the Leon Valley Natural Area Park boundary, and has absolutely no connection with the trail in question.

The referenced Hike \& Bike Trail project was designed to connect a planned regional park at the southern COLV cily limit, along Huebner Creek, through the LV Natural Area Park, and eventually connecting with Rimkus Park. The planned Hike \& Bike Trail did not intersect the referenced trail. Our Mayor did not wish for this trail to travel through the Natural Area Park, misinforming cilizens that 450 trees would be destroyed, and the trail would be 30 ft . wide, none of which is accurate. In fact, the Mayor had attempted to completely circumvent the Natural Area Park with this proposed trail by proposing an alternate route that would have crossed Bandera Rd. at grade. The approved trail route at funding was through the Natural Area Park and met ADA requirements. The portion of the trail grant routing through the Natural Area Park was canceled at the request of the current COLV council. The Mayor has suggested (LV Lion's Roar AugustSeptember 2015) that an alternate route be chosen for the proposed Hike-Bike Trail, oulside the Natural Area Park, and that the Cily of Leon Valley
do the actual construction "eliminating the restrictions of federal grant requirements. That would allow using existing sidewalks to be used as part of the trail".

Again, The existing L.V Natural Area Trail does not meel Federal accessibility requirements (attachment). It is not related to, or associated with the proposed Hike \& Bike Trail. I would very much appreciate someone meeting with me, and several other citizens, and actually louring the trail with this group of citizens. The group includes an attorney, several COLV ex council members, previous, and long time, members of the COLV Park Commission, as well as others familiar with the issue.

I recelved a confirmation and reference number 15-9p259-7u73. I later contacted DOJ as a follow up, and was informed they were burdened with large numbers of complaints and it would be some time before they would contact me.

My concern is that the lssue I have described in attached correspondence has been unresolved for several years, and that too long a delay in remediating the problem will result in addltonal, irreparable harm.

Your assistance in expediting a revlew by DOJ would be greatly appreciated. There are a group of concerned citizens, of which 1 am a member, who have considerable documentation to support our expressed concern and facts.

The Clty of Leon Valley, Texas has title to a Leon Valley Natural Area Park. This park has a perimeter traif with access polnts providing connectivity with an adjecent Leon Valley Raymond Rimkus Park, EvenIng Sun, and Red Jacket Orive, For a number of years, the Natural Area Park has been leased to the Leon Valley-Hlstorical-5ociety. It should benated that the IV Historical Soclety leadership, and membership includes current Leon Valley Mayor Chris Riley, her husband Darby Riley (past President, current Board of Dlrectors, past City of Leon Valley Councilman), and several current and ex Leon Valley Mayors and City Councll members creathg a serious conflict of interest issue. The LV Historical Society has consistently attempted to exercise complete control over the LV Natural Area Park based on it's own usage crlterla.

Current Mayor Riley, and members of the Leon Valley Historical Society vlew the existing traft as primitive and not required to meet Federal accessibility guldellne requirements, LV Historical Society President has indicated to me, members of the Leon Valley Parks Commission, and several previous LV City Council members, that physically challenged wiltors wishing to walk can visit other parks. There have been efforts to dscourage visltors from entering the LV Natural Area Park including 7 signs I removed on a Easter Weekend that had a large photo of a tick with "tick warning" verblage, tree limbs arranged to create walking obstacles, and many calls to San Antonlo Water System and Public Service employees/contractors working in the park along easements. I have retalned coples of the tick warnings that should have fingerpilnts of the poster, and records of many repeated calls to authorized workers. Often threatening legal action.

Included are photographs of the existing LV Narural Area Park trail which clearly demonstrates that the trail fails to meet even minimal Federal accessibility requirements, and does not meet the requirements for the single exception listed in Federal law for a four wheel drive road accepting pedestrlans.

complained of the lack of accesslbility compliance. Mayor have consistentiy rused to requirements. Specifically, I have asked that the trail be widened, smoathed, and an elevated pedestrian bridge be built to span a dralnage channel at the NE park comer, and a culvert at the juncture of the trall at the point where the drainage channel junctures whth Huebner Creek. The Mayor consistentiy resisted any attempt for me to apply to Texas Parks \& WIIdife for Trall Grants to improve this trall. I did however, add connectivity from Rimkus Park and Evening Sun into the Natural Area Park using Texas Parks \& Wildilfe Grant monies \{Federal funds). These extensions move a short distance into the LV Natural Area Park. The Issue is simple, provide better accesslbility for family groups, children, elderly and physically chatlenged visitors.

In a more recent development, a tratl grant was approved by the Alamo Area Metropoflan Pianning Organization-to provide-funding-fortrall-connectivitybetween-proposedregional-park-at the-southernboundary of Leon Valley with the City of San Antonio and the LV Raymond Rlmkus Park. The grant provided for a trall along Huebner Creek, Under the Bandera Road bridge, along the perimeter of the LV Natural Area Park to Raymond Rimkus Park. Mayor Rlley, and the LV Histortcal Soclety leadership attempted in a variety of ways to avoid the routing through the Natural Area Park, attempted to divert
the grant funds to road consiruction, and failing that succeeded in requesting MPO to postpone the grant funding until 2017, and seeking an alternate route. The project was under the control of Texas Department of Transportation, and considerable expense had been Incurred in the inllal engineering design. The poinciple oblectlon volced by Mayor Riley, and others, related to ADA design requirements. The project was described by this opposing group as destroying 4500 trees, 30 foot trall width, Impacting $40 \%$ of the Natural Area Park, bicycle traffic, and negatively affecting wildife, The TXDOT Prolect Manager, Ms Lysette Colbert, indlcated to me that she had looked at the existlng traif and that it did not meet even minlmal Federal accesslbillty requirements, but had no authority to intervene.

Many citlzens are unable to access, and travel the existing trall because of the obvious shortcomings. Complaints were made to TXDOT, Alamo Area MPO, and the local FHWA. I also discussed the issue with representatives of the Texas Parks $\&$ Wildilfe Dept. I was ultimately directed to DOJ as the appropriate complaint venue, The issues relating to the MPO Trall Grant are currently belng reviewed and documented. it is described here to llustrate the resolve of the current Leon valley adminlstratlon, and that of the Leon Valley Historical Soclery leadership to avold compliance with trail accossibllity requirements. The MPO Trail Grant lssue will be addressed at a later date, Again, the current complaint deals specifically with the exlsting LV Naturai Area Park trail. At attachment are coples of several relevant documents and photographs of the existing trall.
