Hi, we're planning to run a story in Monday's Greenwire about Secretary Zinke's failure to resign from Continental Divide International LLC, Double Tap LLC, and Great Northern Veterans Peace Park Inc. before assuming office, as he promised to do in his agreement with the Office of Government Ethics. The story explains that his continued involvement with these entities as well as Lolita's role at CDI and access to top decisionmakers open the secretary up to, at the very least, the appearance of conflicts of interest.

"The claims made by E&E are patently false, and as promised, 'upon confirmation' Secretary Zinke resigned as a managing member from the family's two small businesses and a nonprofit organization which he founded to build the Veterans Peace Park, a sledding park for the children of Whitefish, Montana. The Secretary worked with the career veteran ethics officials at the Department every step of the way. He currently has no management role in any of the organizations identified."

The [resignation of EPA Administrator Scott Pruitt](#) leaves Deputy Administrator Andrew Wheeler in charge of the agency. While Wheeler is most notable for being a lobbyist for coal companies, he also has a track record of lobbying to reduce protections for public lands in the name of expanded uranium mining. Wheeler joins a scandal-plagued cabinet led by investigation-prone Interior Secretary Ryan Zinke.

As a lobbyist for Energy Fuels Resources, Andrew Wheeler asked the Interior Department to [gut Bears Ears National Monument](#) to allow for more uranium mining.

- Last year Wheeler [served as a lobbyist](#) for Energy Fuels Resources (EFR), a company operating uranium mines and mills just outside of Bears Ears National Monument in Utah.
- On [July 17th, 2017](#), Andrew Wheeler and Paul Goranson, an executive at Energy Fuels Resources, met with high-level officials in the Interior Department, including Downey Magallanes, the architect of Secretary Zinke's national monuments report, to "discuss the Bear Ears *[sic]* National Monument."
- Two days later, on July 19th, 2017, Andrew Wheeler met with Vincent DeVito ([see page 123](#)). DeVito is Interior Secretary Ryan Zinke's Counselor for Energy Policy.
- In [a letter to Secretary Zinke](#), EFR made clear their desires, stating:
 - "There are also many other known uranium and vanadium deposits located within the newly created BENM that could provide valuable energy and mineral resources in the future."
 - "EFR respectfully requests that DOI reduce the size of the BENM to only those specific areas or sites, if any, deemed to need additional protection beyond what is already available to Federal land management agencies."

With Scott Pruitt's resignation, Interior Secretary Ryan Zinke is now the most scandal-plagued cabinet member remaining.

- During his tenure, Scott Pruitt racked up an astonishing [19 federal investigations](#). Secretary Zinke is now racing to top that number, already [facing 13 investigations of his own](#).
- Secretary Zinke is currently [under investigation](#) over his role in a Whitefish, MT [real estate deal](#), backed by the chairman of Halliburton, in which the secretary stands to personally benefit. Five months after claiming to have cut ties with the project, Zinke [met with David Lesar, the chairman of Halliburton and the project developer](#) in his official office for 90 minutes, then gave them a private tour of the Lincoln Memorial.
- Zinke has also [faced investigations](#) over his use of chartered aircraft, suppressing science within his agency, violating the Hatch Act, and unjustified reassignment of senior staff, to name a few.

STATEMENT on Interior Inspector General's Report on Ryan and Lola Zinke's misuse of taxpayer dollars

Updated analysis: Zinke is the subject of 18 open, closed, or requested investigations into his conduct

DENVER—In response to today's reporting by *The Washington Post* on a report from the Interior Department Inspector General into improper use of government vehicles by Interior Secretary Ryan Zinke and his wife Lola, the Center for Western Priorities released the following statement from **Executive Director Jen Rokala**:

"This report shows Secretary Zinke's dogged determination to use his office for personal gain, even going so far as to tell Interior's top lawyer to lie to the public to justify his wife's travel. Taxpayers paid \$25,000 to send a security detail along on a two-week romantic getaway. He booked a taxpayer-funded cruise to California's Channel Islands, then claimed his friends and donors were 'stakeholders' so they could get a free ride. Secretary Zinke owes the American people an apology — and a refund."

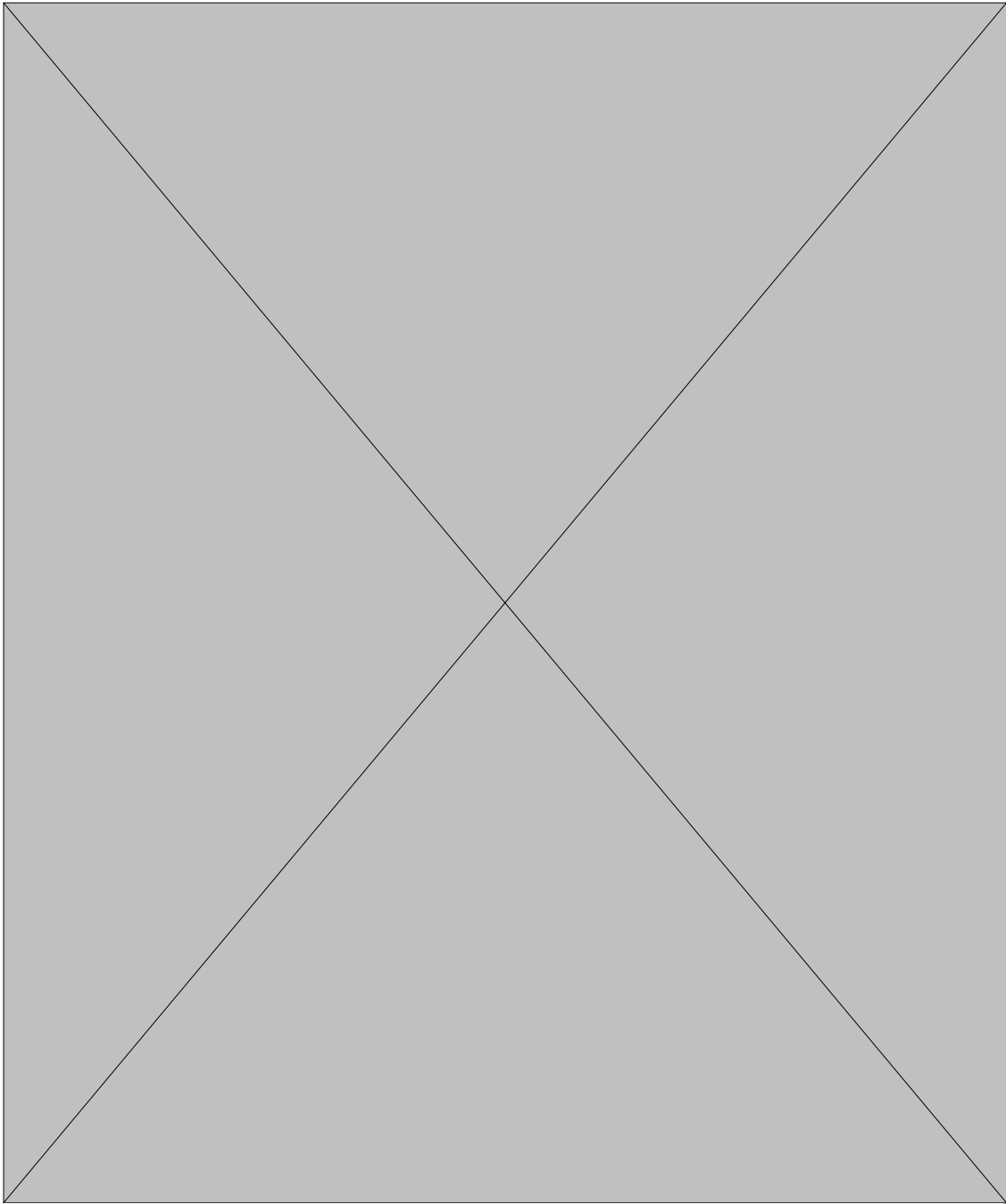
The report also quotes an ethics official who says Secretary Zinke told Acting Solicitor Daniel Jorjani to lie to reporters about his wife's presence on official trips, falsely claiming she was an ombudsman for the department. Staff also raised concerns about how much time was being spent to justify Mrs. Zinke's presence on official trips.

"We're spending taxpayer dollars trying to figure out if she can be a volunteer so that he [Zinke]

doesn't have to pay [reimbursement for her riding in Government vehicles]," Interior ethics official Ed McDonnell said.

The OIG also determined that Zinke spent more than \$13,000 in taxpayer money on challenge coins bearing his name and title.

The Center for Western Priorities today updated its ongoing count of investigations into Secretary Zinke, finding eighteen investigations by the Office of Inspector General and the Office of Special Counsel that have been opened or requested by members of Congress. With today's report, nine of those investigations have been closed and at least five remain open, including the investigation into Secretary Zinke's discussions with the chairman of Halliburton about a land deal in Zinke's hometown of Whitefish, Montana.



Zinke's investigation count now far exceeds his last four predecessors, who collectively were the subject of eleven OIG and OSC investigations. Earlier this week, the Trump administration moved to replace the Acting Interior Inspector General with a political appointee, despite Zinke

being the subject of at least three open investigations at the OIG's office. Late this afternoon, the Interior Department clumsily attempted to walk back the reassignment. **Rokala added:**

"During his confirmation hearing, Ryan Zinke promised 'the most transparent Interior' in his lifetime. Now we know he meant to say 'the most transparently unethical.'"

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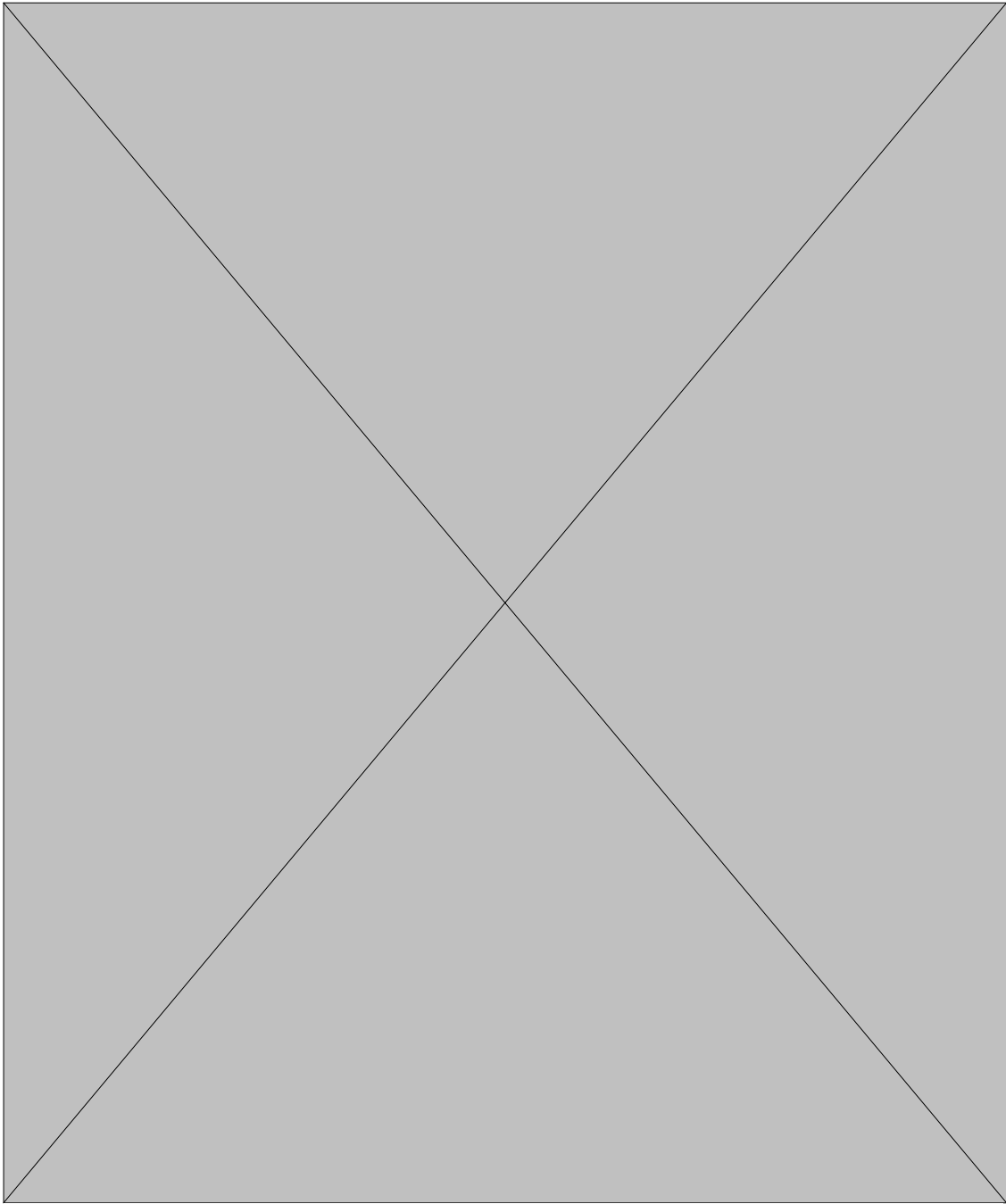

DENVER—In response to today's [reporting by The Washington Post](#) that the Department of the Interior's Office of Inspector General referred an investigation into Secretary Ryan Zinke to the Department of Justice, the Center for Western Priorities released the following statement from **Executive Director Jennifer Rokala**:

"Since stepping into his role as interior secretary, Ryan Zinke has repeatedly leveraged his office for personal gain, attracting unprecedented scrutiny from government investigators. We are glad to see Interior's Inspector General take these matters seriously and refer the investigation into the secretary's conduct to the Department of Justice.

"The timing of Secretary Zinke's attempt to remove Interior's acting Inspector General and replace her with a political appointee earlier this month raises serious questions about whether the secretary was trying to dodge scrutiny. Having looked into some of the issues we discussed earlier today, I just wanted to report back what we've determined.

1. The Vice President's office says that the VP has not invited Secretary Zinke on a trip.
2. Interior's Acting IG does not have a sister, period. No member of her family has been involved with the 95 Karrow developer, and issues have arisen that have prompted her to recuse herself from a probe involving the Secretary.
3. IGs typically refer issues to the Justice Department soon after they identify anything that could be a potential criminal violation. They then continue their inquiry, while conferring with DOJ.
4. I spoke with Dave Taylor, who emphasized that Secretary Zinke's involvement in 95 Karrow was limited to the agreement concerning the foundation's land, which is what we had reported previously.

So I think that covers most of what we discussed. If you would like to comment for the story, or if the Secretary would like to talk before it publishes, let me know. The plan is for it to run in tomorrow's paper.

As you can see from these two different email exchanges, Secretary Zinke engaged in two different matters regarding the Great Northern Veterans Peace Park. One discussion concerns his conversation with Idaho timber on parking, the second is about the disc golf activity the city planner is interested in settling up. This comes after the Secretary had pledged as part of his ethics agreement that when it came to the part, "For a period of one year after my resignation, I will not participate personally and substantially in any particular matter involving specific parties in which I know this entity is a party or represents a party, unless I am first authorized to participate, pursuant to 5 C.F.R. § 2635.502(d)."

I'm planning on doing a blog post about this—I'm not sure whether this will be a short print story, given all the news happening today. But either way, I wanted to flag it for you in case you wanted to comment. Also, I have redacted both the Secretary's personal email and the combination to the gate so as to ensure they do not become public. DENVER—In response to [Interior Secretary Ryan Zinke's tweet](#) attacking Representative Raúl Grijalva, the ranking member and likely chairman of the House Natural Resources Committee, the Center for Western Priorities released the following statement from **Executive Director Jennifer Rokala**:

"Even by Secretary Zinke's standards, this is a new low. It's unbecoming of a cabinet secretary. It's also foolish to pick a fight with a member of Congress who will soon have oversight and subpoena power over your agency. We, and the American people, look forward to full investigations into Secretary Zinke's unprecedented and ongoing ethical lapses."

Secretary Zinke is [facing at least five open investigations](#) into his conduct, the most serious of which involves a land deal with the chairman of Halliburton. After meeting with the developer and Halliburton Chairman David Lesar in the secretary's office, [the group went to the Biergarten Haus](#) in Washington, DC to discuss Zinke's long-standing dream of opening a brewpub in Zinke's hometown of Whitefish.

Zinke's investigation count, totaling [eighteen open and closed investigations](#), now far exceeds his last four predecessors, who collectively were the subject of eleven Office of Inspector General and the Office of Special Counsel investigations.

Secretary Zinke attacked America's public lands every step of the way

DENVER—After serving nearly two years as Interior Secretary, President Trump announced that Ryan Zinke is resigning at the end of the year. Zinke has attracted unprecedented scrutiny from government investigators, accumulating at least 18 opened or requested investigations into his ethical conduct. One of these investigations has been referred to the Department of Justice.

The secretary's departure leaves behind a lamentable legacy defined by opening large swaths of public lands to oil and gas development, cutting out the public from decision-making, and eliminating large portions of two national monuments in Utah.

Deputy Interior Secretary David Bernhardt is expected to take over the Interior Department until a new secretary is confirmed by the Senate. In response to Ryan Zinke's resignation as Interior secretary, the Center for Western Priorities released the following statement from **Executive Director Jennifer Rokala**:

"Ryan Zinke will go down as the most anti-conservation Interior secretary in our nation's history. By following President Trump's marching orders to attack our public lands, Secretary Zinke oversaw an unprecedented and likely illegal attack on America's national monuments.

"Surrounding himself with former lobbyists, it quickly became clear that Ryan Zinke was a pawn for the oil and gas industry. We can expect more of the same from Acting Secretary David Bernhardt, but without the laughable Teddy Roosevelt comparisons."

During his tenure at the Interior Department, Zinke eliminated national monument protections from more than 2 million acres of public lands, opening the lands to mining and oil development. This action is still being challenged in federal court in Washington D.C.

Since President Trump took office, the Bureau of Land Management has offered up more than 13 million acres of public lands for oil and gas drilling as part of Zinke's 'energy dominance' agenda—an area nearly the size of West Virginia. Under Zinke's management, the Interior Department acted upon dozens of oil and mining industry wishes, including: lifting a moratorium on coal leasing, eliminating the BLM's methane waste rule, eliminating a rule to ensure taxpayers get a fair share for resources extracted on public lands, cutting out the public from providing input on land management decisions, and overhauling management plans for sage-grouse habitat.

Deputy Interior Secretary David Bernhardt's past lobbying client list includes more than a dozen companies that have regular business before the Interior Department, including Halliburton, Noble Energy, Cadiz Inc., and the Independent Petroleum Association trade group. Bernhardt also has a long track record lobbying for anti-wildlife clients and has repeatedly attempted to weaken endangered species protections.

Recently, Ryan Zinke tried to replace Interior's acting Inspector General shortly after she referred an investigation into Secretary Zinke to the Department of Justice. Known, open investigations into Ryan Zinke include:

- Zinke's decision to ignore the advice of career Interior Department experts and block two Connecticut tribes.
- Zinke's involvement in a land deal in Whitefish, Montana with the chairman of Halliburton

The Interior Department's Office of Inspector General already determined that Ryan Zinke could have avoided spending \$12,000 on a chartered flight to give a speech to a campaign donor, spent \$25,000 to send a security detail along on a two-week vacation, and falsely claimed his wife was an ombudsman for the department to avoid paying for her travel.
